Dear Fellows, Members, Inceptors and Affiliates,

Please take note of the following announcements:

### **I. Announcement from the Education Committee**

In line with the recent revision of the Academy CME/CPD guideline, a revised College CME/CPD guideline has been drafted and subsequently endorsed by the College Council as well as the Academy for use from 2005 onwards. The revised CME/CPD guideline is enclosed in Appendix I and can also be found on the College Website.

Upon synchronisation of CME/CPD cycle for all Academy Fellows, all College Fellows will have their CME/CPD cycle starting afresh on 1.1.2005. As for Fellows who partially fulfilled the CME requirements by 31.12.2004, remedial CME should be proposed and be completed by 30.6.2005 in addition to the CME/CPD requirements.

Fellows can now access the Web-based Membership and Learning Management System ([www.mlms.org.hk](http://www.mlms.org.hk)) of the Academy to check on CME/CPD accredited events, to score CME/CPD points and to view your updated CME/CPD record. **Miss Kristy Cheung** of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine can be contacted at Tel: 2871-8897 if technical problems such as account activation are encountered.

### **II. List of approved CME activities (July - December 2004)**

The list of approved CME activities for the period between July and December 2004 is enclosed in Appendix II for fellow's reference. The list has also been uploaded onto the College website.

## Appendix I

### THE HONG KONG COLLEGE OF PSYCHIATRISTS

#### Principles and Guidelines on Continuing Medical Education (CME) and Continuous Professional Development (CPD)

#### 1. Objective

The purpose of CME/CPD is to keep Fellows informed and up-to-date on current medical advances, and to maintain a high standard of practice in psychiatry through continuous professional development.

#### 2. Supervision

2.1 The CME/CPD programme will seek formal approval from the Education Committee of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM) before implementation.

2.2 Any changes to the CME/CPD programme will also be approved by the Academy Education Committee before implementation.

2.3 All Fellows of the College who are also Fellows of the HKAM must satisfy the full requirements of the CME/CPD programme by the end of each Cycle.

2.4 Fellows must respond to call for CME/CPD returns from the College, and submit all returns with required proof within the defined period of time.

2.5 The College will ensure compliance with CME/CPD requirements. Non-compliance will be recorded and reported to the Academy Education Committee. This Committee has been empowered to recommend to HKAM Council the suspension of delinquent Fellows, unless it is satisfied that there are mitigating circumstances, and that deficiencies can be remedied within an acceptable time.

2.6 All notices sent to the address last provided by a Fellow to the College will be deemed to have been received by that Fellow, and it is the responsibility of a Fellow to update the College of his contact address whenever it is changed.

2.7 All operations issues related to CME/CPD will be undertaken by the Education Committee of the College.

#### 3. The Cycle

3.1 A Cycle of CME/CPD assessment shall span three years.

3.2 The CME/CPD cycle will be synchronized with the duration of practising certificates; and fixed cycle will be adopted once the Medical Council of Hong Kong have implemented linking of CME/CPD to the renewal of practising certificates. The fixed cycle commences at a date determined by HKAM for current Fellows.

3.3 Once synchronization is implemented, new Fellows will commence their first cycle immediately upon their admission to Academy Fellowship; and the required CME points for the first cycle will be counted on pro-rata basis. The date of commencement will be recorded for each Fellow.

3.4 For satisfactory CME/CPD performance, in each calendar year, the programme requires a Fellow to obtain an advisable minimum of **20 CME Points** from at least 2 separate types of CME/CPD activities set in Section 5.

3.5 A Fellow who has not achieved the advisable minimum CME points in one year will receive a reminder from the College and will be required to make up the insufficient points in the following year. If a minimum of **90 CME/CPD Points** cannot be accumulated in any three consecutive years, the Fellow will be reported to the Education Committee of the Academy of Medicine for consideration of sanction.

#### 4. Measurement of Activities

One Point of CME/CPD activity is normally equivalent to one hour of audience participation in a Formal College-Approved Activity (FCAA).

#### 5. Accreditable CME/CPD Activities

##### 5.1 Self-study

- a) Self-study is accepted as a form of CME/CPD.
- b) Self-study is only accredited subject to prior approval from the College, with evidence that it has been carried out diligently.
- c) Self-assessment programmes currently accredited by overseas Psychiatric Colleges or Academic Institutions require prior approval from the College.

Fellows may subscribe to such approved programmes on an individual basis and submit to the College Education Committee documentary evidence of participation.

Such programme may be awarded up to **15 CME/CPD Points** per annum.

- d) Journal reading from a College-approved list is an acceptable form of Self-study. Evidence in form of written summary is required. **1 CME/CPD Point** can be awarded from reading any article of the Journal. A maximum of **2 CME/CPD Points** can be awarded from reading any particular review article of the Journal. The approved list may be amended by the College from time to time.

Other journals in psychiatry and subspecialties may be accredited but require prior approval by the College Education Committee.

- e) Online Self-Study program on the Membership & Learning Management System (MLMS) site currently accredited by the College may be awarded up to a maximum of **15 CME/CPD Points** per annum.
- f) Self-study may be accredited a maximum of **75 CME/CPD Points** per three-year cycle.

##### 5.2 Passive Participation

- a) **1 CME/CPD Point** is awarded for each hour of audience participation in a FCAA. For approved long congress or conference (either local or overseas) **1 CME /CPD Point** is awarded for each hour of audience participation up to a maximum of **6 CME/CPD Points** per day for up to three days for that particular conference/congress.
- b) Organising bodies or Fellows must seek from the College Education Committee prior accreditation for each meeting, and supply a summary of contents and speaker. Criteria to accredit such meetings will be determined by the Education Committee.
- c) Postgraduate meetings organised by other Academy Colleges, their subspecialty societies and other Associations may also be accredited by the College as List B activities, if prior approval is sought and received in writing. CME Points equivalent to College of Psychiatrists organised activities may be awarded to Psychiatric Fellows for attendance at such meetings. A maximum of **15 CME/CPD Points** in each three-year cycle may be accredited for Passive Participation at FCAA organised by other Academy Colleges.
- d) Proof of attendance must be provided.
- e) Passive Participation as defined above may be accredited a maximum of **75 CME/CPD Points** per three-year cycle.

##### 5.3 Active Participation

- a) Active Participation includes chairing or presenting in a FCAA.

- b) Active Participation may be awarded a maximum of **3 CME/CPD Points** if no collection of data is involved, and **6 CME/CPD Points** if collection or analysis of data is involved.
- c) For approved long congress or conference (either local or overseas), a maximum of **6 CME/CPD Points** per day up to three days can be awarded for that particular conference/congress.
- d) Active participation may be accredited a maximum of **75 CME/CPD Points** per three-year cycle.

#### 5.4 Publications

- a) A maximum of **10 CME/CPD Points** may be awarded to the chief author, and **5 CME/CPD Points** for secondary authorship of each Publication in journals published by the College, HKAM and indexed international journals.
- b) A maximum of **5 CME/CPD Points** may be awarded to the chief author, and **2 CME/CPD Points** for secondary authorship of each Publication in non-indexed international journals, journals published by other constituent Colleges of HKAM, or other local journals provided that there is prior approval from the College Education Committee.
- c) A maximum of **10 CME/CPD Points** may be awarded to the chief author, and **5 CME/CPD Points** for secondary authorship of each chapter or section of a textbook of psychiatry.
- d) A maximum of **10 CME/CPD Points** may be awarded to the author of a thesis or treatise on a topic in preparatory and published for a post-graduate degree conferred by a local university or equivalent.
- e) Publications may be accredited a maximum of **75 CME/CPD Points** per three-year cycle.

#### 5.5 Quality Assurance & Medical Audits

- a) The College may accept approved quality assurance activities on clinical audit and quality improvement projects that are directly related to the practice of psychiatry for CME/CPD accreditation.
- b) Participation in approved quality assurance activities would be evaluated by written documentation and/or report. A maximum of **5 CME/CPD Points** can be granted per project.
- c) For presentation of the quality assurance project in Formal College Approved Quality Assurance Programme (FCAQAP), **3 additional CME/CPD Points** can be accredited.
- d) A maximum of **5 CME/CPD Points** may be awarded to all authors of a College approved Quality Assurance Report.
- e) Maximum accredited points for all quality assurance-related activities in a three-year CME cycle is **30 CME/CPD Points**.

#### 5.6 Conducting Examinations

A Fellow participating as Examiner in a College Examination will be awarded a maximum of **10 CME/CPD Points** in one year.

#### 5.7 Research

- a) Research activities are accepted as a form of CME/CPD subject to documentary description of the Fellow's role in the research activities normally to be certified by the principal investigator.
- b) Up to **3 CME/CPD points** may be granted per approved project.
- c) A maximum of **15 CME/CPD Points** in each three-year cycle may be accredited for Research activities.

#### 5.8 Development of New Technologies or Services

- a) The Development of New Services or Technologies is accepted as a form of CME/CPD subject to full documentation of **the Fellow's role** in the project concerned.
- b) Up to **3 CME/CPD points** may be granted per project.
- c) A maximum of **15 CME/CPD Points** per three year cycle.

#### 5.9 Undergraduate Teaching

- a) Undergraduate Teaching does not attract any CME Points.
- b) Consideration can be given to development of teaching materials. Fellows are required to submit documentation of the teaching materials concerned to the College Education Committee. **1 CME/CPD point** may be awarded for providing teaching materials of each topic.
- c) Maximum accredited points for all Undergraduate Teaching activities in a three-year CME cycle is **10 CME/CPD Points**.

#### 5.10 Postgraduate Teaching

Postgraduate Teaching activities other than those listed under Sections 5.2 and 5.3 do not attract CME/CPD Points.

#### 5.11 Mortality & Morbidity Meetings

- a) Participation in accredited mortality & morbidity meetings **in training units** can be awarded CME/CPD points subject to prior approval.
- b) **1 CME/CPD Point** per meeting may be granted.
- c) A maximum of **10 CME/CPD Points** per three year cycle.

#### 5.12 Postgraduate Courses

- a) Attending a course leading to post-graduate qualification can be accepted as a form of CME/CPD.
- b) Up to **5 CME/CPD points** may be granted per course.
- c) A maximum of **15 CME/CPD Points** in each three-year cycle may be accredited for attending Postgraduate Courses.

#### 5.13 Development of CME/CPD Materials

- a) Participation in development of CME/CPD materials for self-study or e-learning can be awarded CME/CPD points.
- b) Fellows are required to submit the articles as documentary proof.
- c) Up to **3 CME/CPD points** may be granted per article .
- d) A maximum of **15 CME/CPD Points** in each three-year cycle may be accredited for Development of CME/CPD Materials.

#### 5.14 Activities for Improvement of Patient Care

- a) Participation in learning/activities that enhances the ability to practice clinical skills, patient management and care, e.g. information technology, interpersonal and communication skill training, can be awarded CME/CPD points.
- b) **1 CME/CPD point** per activity may be granted.
- c) Maximum accredited points for all Activities for Improvement of Patient Care in a three-year CME cycle is **10 CME/CPD Points**.

#### 5.15 Grand Rounds in Training Units

- a) Participation in accredited grand rounds in training units can be awarded CME/CPD points.
- b) **1 CME/CPD point** per grand round may be granted.
- c) A maximum of **10 CME/CPD Points** in each three-year cycle may be accredited for all Grand Rounds in Training Units

5.16 Other Activities of the College and Academy

- a) Participation as CME Assessor may be accredited a maximum of **30 CME /CPDPoints** per three-year cycle.
- b) Participation as Journal Reviewer for the College Journal may be awarded **2 CME/CPD Points** per paper up to **18 CME/CPD Points** per cycle.

**6. Minimum CME Requirements**

6.1 The minimum CME/CPD requirement is **90 Points** in each three-year cycle. CME/CPD points accumulated in excess of the requirement of one cycle cannot be carried forward to the next cycle.

6.2 The advisable minimum annual CME/CPD requirement is **20 Points**.

**7. Certification**

The Education Committee will certify completion of CME/CPD requirements for Psychiatric Fellows at the end of each cycle.

**8. CME Registry**

The Education Committee will maintain a Register of Psychiatric Fellows who have been awarded certification under Section 7.

**9. Remarks**

As for CME/CPD exemption, non-compliance and certificate for Specialist Registration, Psychiatric Fellows can refer to the revised Academy CME/CPD guidelines in summer 2004.

Supplementary CME Guidelines  
**on Self-study - Journal Reading**

1. Journal reading from a College-approved list is an acceptable form of Self-study. The accredited Journal List (as in September 2004) is as follows :
  - Acta Psychiatrica Scandinavica
  - Advances in Psychiatric Treatment
  - American Journal of Psychiatry
  - Archives of General Psychiatry
  - Australian and New Zealand Journal of Psychiatry
  - British Journal of Psychiatry
  - Canadian Journal of Psychiatry
  - Current Opinion in Psychiatry
  - Hong Kong Journal of Psychiatry
  - Journal of the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry
  - Psychiatric Annuals
  - Psychological Medicine
2. Evidence in form of written summary is required to be submitted to the CME Assessor by using the attached CME/Self-Study Journal Reading Summary Form. You should complete the Form from time to time when you read the approved journals and send it back to the CME Assessor.
3. Articles from journals listed under the most recent Journal Citation Report in the subject category "Psychiatry" with an impact factor above 1.0 can also be accepted for CME/CPD accreditation on Self Study of Journal Reading. In order to facilitate assessment for CME/CPD points, Fellows are requested to submit the summary with a copy of the article if it is from a journal outside the College approved list.
4. The CME Assessor would assess the submitted summary and would state the actual CME/CPD point your summary scored. All the marked summaries will be filed and your CME/CPD score will be entered to your Continuing Education Record Form by the end of each CME Calendar year.

**Hong Kong College of Psychiatrists**  
CME/CPD Supplementary Guidelines on  
**Formal College Approval Activities (FCAA)**

1. According to the principles laid down by the Academy, at least 30 CME/CPD points of FCAA should be arranged by the College. In order to be approved as FCAA, the activities should fulfill the following criteria;
  - a. At least 50% of the meetings should be held after office hours or in week-ends, i.e. activities should be held at a convenient time for the fellows.
  - b. The meeting should be opened to all Fellows/Members/Inceptors of the College;
  - c. In any one meeting, a minimum of 20 seats or participants is required;
  - d. All the Fellows/Members/Inceptors of the College should be informed about the activities.
2. The meetings approved by the Education Committee as FCAA include
  - a. all the Scientific Meetings organised by the College;



- b. Meetings organised by other Academy Colleges , their subspecialty societies and other Associations approved as FCAA by the College of Psychiatrists
- c. Central Academic Course is recognised as CME/CPD activities. Being chairman or speaker in Central Academic Course (CAC) of the Training Scheme of the College would attract 3 points per session and being an audience would attract one point per hour of attendance. Please contact the responsible tutor/ course organiser for booking of seats. The tutor/course organiser would keep a list of attendance of the Fellows and send it back to the Education Committee for recording.
- d. The following international events are approved as FCAA and fellows attending these events do not need to apply for prior approval:
  - 1. World Psychiatric Association (WPA) World Congress
  - 2. American Psychiatric Association Annual Meeting
  - 3. Royal College of Psychiatrists Annual Scientific Meeting
  - 4. Collegium Internationale Neuropsychopharmacologium Congress
  - 5. European Neuropsychopharmacology Congress
  - 6. International Conference on Schizophrenia
  - 7. International Psychogeriatric Association Biannual Meeting
  - 8. International Psychogeriatric Association Regional Meeting

The above list might change from time to time, for up-dated information, please refer to the College Newsletter.

- 3. For any other activities as passive or active participant, individual fellows should seek prior approval if they want to gain CME/CPD points from these activities.
- 4. In order to facilitate the Fellows to apply for approval of certain activities for CME/CPD scoring, a particular form is designed for the said purpose.
- 5. Whenever you attend any FCAA, please sign your attendance and the attendance form would be kept by the Education Committee for verification. Please always record your attendance to any meetings as it is the Fellow's responsibility to keep the CME/CPD Record Form up-dated. Your Record Form should be sent to the Honorary Secretary of the Education Committee for assessment by the end of the CME/CPD calendar year.
- 6. After assessment of your annual Record Form, the Education Committee/CME assessors will confirm the total CME/CPD points you have scored for that calendar year and all the documents will be returned to you . Only the annual CME score will be entered into a database and such record will be kept up to 6 years by the College.
- 7. Please keep your CME/CPD Recording Form for at least three years.
