Dear Fellows, Members, Inceptors and Affiliates

Please kindly take note of the following announcement:

A. YAO YIU SAI Education and Charitable Memorial Fund

The College has again received a generous donation from the above named fund. After repeated consultations and discussion, the council has decided to use the fund in the manner similar to last year:

1. The best Part 2 and Part 3 candidates in the coming Fellowship examination will each be given not more than HKD 20,000 to either do an overseas attachment in psychiatry of his / her choice before July 2005 or to attend the Annual Meeting of the Royal College of Psychiatrists from 20 to 23 June in Edinburgh.
2. 2 scholarships, each of not more than HKD 20,000 will be offered to fellows of or less than 3 years seniority to do an overseas attachment to be completed before July 2005. Interested fellows please apply to Dr YK NG with (a) your plan of attachment, including reasons why your choice of subspecialty should be important to psychiatry in the territory, (b) proof of acceptance by the host department, if any, (c) recommendation by your consultant / COS.
3. The council reserves the right to allocate more or less scholarships in any one category, or not to do so at all. In case more than 2 applicants apply for category 2 there will be a panel deciding on the most suitable candidate(s).
4. Applications of category 2 should reach Dr YK NG at Kwai Chung Hospital by post, or at 2741 7452 by fax or ngyk@ha.org.hk by email before 30 November 2004.
5. Let us make good use of the generosity. If you have other ideas you can send them to Dr YK NG for future considerations.

B. Education Committee

1. **CME Cycle**

Starting from 1 January 2005, the commencement date of CME cycle of all Fellows will be synchronized upon the Medical Council of Hong Kong proposed implementation of CME/CPD for all registered medical practitioners from 2005. All Fellows will be informed about their own required CME points for the current cycle till

31 December 2004 on pro-rata basis. The Fellows CME record will be updated after July 2004.

2. Review of College CME Guidelines

A work group has been formed to review the College CME Guidelines. Work group members include Dr TL Lo (Convenor), Dr TK Tsoi, Dr YK Ng, Prof Linda Lam and Dr TK Poon. In order to facilitate Continuing Medical Education as well as Continuous Professional Development of our Fellows, the review will take reference of the pending revision of the Academy CPD/CME guidelines and the proposed linking of CPD/CME compliance to renewal of Practicing Certificate.

3. CME for Members and Inceptors

Upon the Medical Council of Hong Kong (MCHK) proposed implementation of mandatory CME/CPD for all registered medical practitioners in Hong Kong, all College Members and Inceptors will be encouraged to register with the Academy as CME administrator from 2005. Selected Central Academic Programme will be submitted to MCHK for CME accreditation from 2005 as well.

4. MLMS

To facilitate CME and to expedite CME update for individual Fellows, Fellows can access the web-based Membership and Learning Management System (www.mlms.org.hk) of the Academy. The system allows Fellows to check on CME accredited events, to score CME on MCQs set by Hong Kong Medical Journal and to update CME record. Academy had sent out activation code and password to each Fellow to activate his/her account, please contact Academy if you have not received the number.

5. Minimum requirement of psychiatric training for the College Part II examination

Trainees would be allowed to attempt local Part II examination after 30 months of training. Trainees would be allowed to choose, after 30 months of basic psychiatric training and having passed the local Part II examination, either staying in basic psychiatric training further up to 36 months in total or proceeding to higher psychiatric training immediately. For the latter choice, trainees need to undergo another half year of higher training despite passing the exit examination before conferment of Fellowship.

6. Cross recognition of specialty training

Cross recognition of electives of other clinical specialties are up to 6 months period. Recognition is subject to documentary proof by individual trainee holding training post approved by the respective Specialty College in Hong Kong.

7. CME Returns

Last but not least, all Fellows are reminded to send in their annual CME returns 03/04 to Dr TL LO, Chairman, Education Committee, c/o Kwai Chung Hospital on or

before 31 July 2004. Please refer to attached CME lists (please note that List B will only be available on the College website).
